How has your daily life been affected by the guarantine or Corona Virus?

Do you think that the safety precautions such as masks, social distancing, and hand washing are too much, too little, or just enough?

Have your thoughts about the pandemic changed at all since March of 2020?

No, I considered it a danger then and I consider it a danger now. Unlike our president, I considered it a terrible and dangerous plague. I've studied plagues in the past like the great European plague and such.
